
Crate Wine Holder

Level of Effort: Hard | Estimated Time Required: 1 Hour



SUPPLY LIST

Vintage Wine Crate

3.5" Hole Saw

Hand Saw

1x4 Piece of Wood

Screws

Wood Glue

STEP-BY-STEP INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Measure the circumference at the widest point of one or two wine bottles. This will give you an idea how big of a hole you'll need to cut in the crate so that the bottles will fit in easily.
- 2. On the backside of the crate, measure and mark exactly where you'll be cutting. Using the 3.5" hole saw, carefully cut out the holes.
- 3. Measure and cut a piece of the 1x4 to fit the length of the crate. This will fit inside to support the weight of the bottles. Use wood glue first to attach the wood, and then use the screws to secure it.
- 4. Hang on the wall using toggle bolts.





Wine Glass Holder

Level of Effort: Medium | Estimated Time Required: 30 minutes



SUPPLY LIST

Old Rake

Hand Saw

Sandpaper/Sander

Drill

Twine

STEP-BY-STEP INSTRUCTIONS:

1.Saw off the handle about 6-8 inches from the rake.

- 2. Sand the new end of the handle.
- 3. Stain or paint the new end of the handle.
- 4. Drill a small hole through the end of the handle and tie a 6-8 inch piece of twine through the hole.
- 5. Hang the rake on a secure nail on the wall. Hang wine glasses on the fingers of the rake.
